RECTOR'S REPORT TO THE ANNUAL MEETING

The State of the Parish 2010 to 2011

THE PARISH Endowment Fund drive has done remarkably well. Thanks to your generous contributions, it currently totals some \$191,000. This brings us to within \$9,000 of our initial \$200,000 goal. This success gives us the necessary confidence to proceed to the second, longer term, phase of the drive to increase the amount in the fund to \$500,000.

The Endowment Fund is intended to cushion church programs that serve both in the parish and to the wider community from the financial downturns that periodically

afflict the economy

The Endowment Fund has amply proved its worth during the current recession. The economic slump has taken a hefty17 percent bite out of pledged and plate offerings. But while earnings from the fund have helped offset (albeit not completely) the decline, we are still not out of the woods.

Thus we are asking you prayerfully to consider increasing your pledges this year. We know that times are tough, but

parishes just like parishioners are feeling the pinch.

Finances always get tight as summer approaches. Family vacations tend to play havoc with church cash flow. If you are planning a trip, **Bill Hawkins**, our long-suffering treasurer, would much appreciate it if you paid your pledge

before you went away, rather than upon your return.

Our books are still in the black thanks to a good deal of creative thinking, ruthless cost-cutting measures, financial sacrifices by the staff and a hefty increase in volunteer hours.

But there is a limit to how much fat can be trimmed before

you start hacking away at bone, blood, muscle and sinews.

Aside from fiscal woes, the parish has enjoyed another successful year. We have welcome new membersalthough, sadly, we have said a final earthly farewell to a number of old friends – including a couple of our founders.

Church activities, however, were enthusiastically supported and our work in the wider community has continued to expand, serving a growing a growing number of civic organizations and health care institutions.

The key organizer of the parish's community service team is **Mrs. Anne Hawkins**, Director of Pastoral Care. She also edits the newsletter, and coordinates our remarkably successful community blood drives.

We provide chaplains for organizations including the U.S. Navy League, the English Speaking Union and the St. George's Society. We also provide pastoral care and support at The Joseph Richey Hospice, Union Memorial Hospital and the Greater Baltimore Medical Center.

The clergy conduct regular church services at retirement communities and nursing homes, including Glen Meadows, Mays Chapel Ridge, Genesis at Brightwood, Genesis at Mays Chapel, Lorien at Mays Chapel, Lorien in Columbia and Roland Park Place, as well as occasional services at other communities including Heart Homes, Blakehurst, Edenwald and Keswick. The parish continues its monthly collections of non-perishable foodstuffs and household goods for **At Jacob's Well**, a charity that helps Baltimore's mentally ill homeless population.

On June 3rd, **The Joseph Richey Hospice's** new hospice

for children, Dr. Bob's Place, opened its doors. The hospice has been a particular focus of our community service for upwards of 20 years and parishioner **Bea Kallina**, the Volunteer Coordinator, estimates that the new children's hospice will ultimately increase demand for our pastoral care

and volunteer services

Our Tuesday and Friday morning Bible Studies are led by Brock Johnson who took over the Friday Morning group from veteran Bible teacher Cal Collier.

The Tuesday morning, Knitting Circle - mentored by Happy Riley and Karen Ruthig – meets in the parish hall to laugh and chat while producing beautifully crafted comforts for the patients at the Joseph Richey Hospice and folks on the parish sick list. They are always ready to welcome new members - learners or expert. And it is not necessary to be physically present to join the circle.

The committee organized a host of other events, including summer picnics, autumn picnics and a diet-busing Shrove Tuesday Pancake & Sausage Supper. The committee's Silly Summer Suppers – a brainchild of Anne Hawkins and Charlotte Hawtin –ran through the summer and much of the fall, attracting an enthusiastic following not only among parishioners, but among folks in the neighborhood.

Adric, our Choirmaster & Organist, and the Choir of Men & Boys have continued their splendid program of Choral Evensongs. These services are generally sung on the first Sunday of the month and the offertory is in aid of the choir's special charity, **Dr. Bob's Place**, the Joseph Richey Hospice's new pediatric hospice.

Three or four Sundays a month during the academic year, the choir sings **Choral Mattins**. The officiant is usually **Peter Threadgill**, our head lay reader and resident composer. Indeed, from time to time, you will hear the choir singing music Peter, himself, has composed.

A special vote of thanks goes to the talented **Don Ruthig.** He seems to set on singlehandedly refurbishing the church. Not least, he has completed painting the much admired frieze on side and west walls of the sanctuary.

He has also presented Adric with a handsome oak music stand and a cupboard for the choir's vestments; the clergy with a much needed vestment chest; and the Altar Guild with a chest for the altar hangings. And with only four days notice, he "ran up" a gorgeous crozier for Bishop Brian March to use for confirmations and the recent Diocesan Synod.

St. Stephen's Women's Group, under the leadership of Ann Bonnell and Mavis Turner, enjoyed another busy year .Recently Ann retired from the leadership, and her shoes have been ably filled by **Joyce Perlberg**.
